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Remember Souvenir

One of his milestone projects is "Remember Souvenir", in the former headquarters of pharmaceuticals company Solvay in Bruxelles. Initially planned for a few weeks, the 18 months project led him to paint nearly 450,000 square ft of an abandoned building which was going to be demolished. An ephemeral pharaonic project in which the artist invested space (doors, roof, facade, windows) and posted his memories, in the form of writings and portraits. About 150 drawing notebooks, accumulated over the past twenty years, served him as the starting point of this project.

Each room utilizeed and no wall left bare, his words flow by the thousands. Each room like a chapter where with spray and brush, he tells his story and that of his city and his freinds. All is springing from his life experience and his encounters. Passer bys are important and take a permanant life. But his family and love remain the center of the emotion. His stories are personal and intimate and we are touched and feel the universality of human emotion at the same time.

Working with acrylic paint, markers, spray paint, etc., the Typographic Artist superposes words to create his desired message. Often in Black, Grey and White, but also adding colors for this exhibition, he weaves the words using different sizes, fonts styles and mediums, to possess the space of the canvas. The inspiration is both spontaneous and constructed. The artist takes from the thousands of daily sketches and profiles of random passerbys in his notebooks. The inspiration seems born from the instant. However, through the layering process, the artwork reveals an unmistakable sense and attention to the construction and relations between shapes and zones of the canvas. With long experience in Street Art, Graffiti and Stickers Denis Meyers is able to draw viewers in to his universe of words.

BIO

Born in 1979, Denis Meyers is a Belgian urban artist. He studied at the National Superior School of Arts and Visuals of la Cambre, in Brussels, city where he currently lives and works. Denis Meyers is particularly known for his frescoes and Murals and stickers interlacing typographic elements, words, and Human Faces, which he calls his "perso". You may sometimes see by chance on a stret corner on of his stickers, printed and cut out by hand, spread in the urban space. The artist defines himself as a typographer, a vocation that he inherited from his grandfather, Lucien De Roeck (1915-2002) which created among others the ensemble of the World Expo poster of 1958. It is with him that he started to write and draw every day.

These faces and profiles are what he calls his "Perso", sometimes by themselves, sometimes interlaced with words, these "Persos" were a central feature of "Remember Souvenir".

A few Windows were saved by the artists with the help of his friends from the demolition and set aside.

We are happy to propose these windows at Galerie l'Atelier.


The sizes are 167×119 cm (66 x 47") for the metal framed windows and 186 cm x 149 cm (73 x 59") for the wooden framed windows.










